Committee

As many of you will have noticed, the committee have been making some changes to the way in which we communicate with the members of Swindon U3A. For the first time the processes by which the yearbook is updated and published have been conducted digitally with support offered for those who find this way of working a bit daunting. This has involved a considerable amount of work for all those involved in the process and they have to be congratulated for making the new process work so smoothly considering all that was involved. Similarly the process for groups to book a table for Open Day was also done through an automated process. While there were a few teething problems with the Yearbook and Open Day processes, on the whole it was very successful and the committee is grateful for your patience and co-operation while the new systems "bed in".

The revised constitution produced by the Third Age Trust which will be recommended by the committee for ratification by the membership at our AGM on the 14th October has once again highlighted the difficulty we have in finding members to join the management committee. It is made clear that all members of the management committee can only serve for a maximum of 3 years. During the MC Awayday in October we will be drawing up a succession plan to ensure that this requirement is put into place within the near future. To do this and ensure that Swindon U3A keeps going, we need more people to come forward and join the committee now so that there is a smooth transition when those with experience leave.

Please give joining the committee your urgent consideration now otherwise we may in a couple of years be back in the situation we were in when I offered to become a committee member. At that point all members were emailed with the message that if no-one stepped forward to take on the role of chair or vice chair, Swindon

U3A would have to close. We are one of the most successful U3As in the country with a thriving membership and it would be a huge loss if we cannot keep going because we do not have a committee. If you would prefer to “dip your toes in the water” by joining the events committee or the IT development committee to find out how the work of these groups feeds into that of the management committee, please contact me for further details at the above email address.

In a similar vein, no-one has yet come forward to take over the organisation of the distribution of the Newsletter, What’s On and Yearbooks. David and Jackie have very kindly agreed to continue in this role until the end of January. If no-one has offered to take over by that time, the committee will have to make alternative arrangements whereby members receive these publications. If you are able to help please either contact David and Jackie or myself.

As our new Swindon U3A year swings into action, I wish you all another action packed and fun filled time living together, talking together and working together.
